EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 23

AN ORDER REORGANIZING THE CITY DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COUNCIL

WHEREAS, Republic Act 10121 or the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010 mandates the creation of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (CDRRMC) in every local government unit.;

WHEREAS, the City Government of Imus should develop, promote, and implement a comprehensive City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (CDRRMP) that aims to strengthen the capacity of the local government unit, together with partner stakeholders, to build disaster-resilient communities, and to institutionalize arrangements and measures for reducing disaster risks. These include projecting climate change risks, enhancing disaster preparedness, and developing response capabilities at all levels.

WHEREAS, the City Government of Imus should provide maximum care, assistance, and services to individuals and families affected by disasters, implement emergency rehabilitation projections to lessen the impact of disasters, and facilitate resumption of normal social and economic activities.

WHEREAS, the City Government of Imus should engage the participation of other government institutions, Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), the private sector, and volunteers in the LGU's disaster risk reduction programs towards proper use of resources and effective delivery of services to the citizenry;

WHEREAS, some of its members of the CDRRM are no longer connected with the City Government or re-assigned from their work station. Further, it is necessary to include additional members from the Civic Society Organizations. Thus, the need to reorganize the CDRRMC.

NOW, therefore, I, ALEX L. ADVINCULA, Chairperson CDRRMC, Mayor of the City of Imus, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order the reorganization of the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council of the City of Imus and immediately appoint the new members in order to carry out the basic principles and objectives of RA 10121.

Section 2. FUNCTIONS. The CDRRMC shall have the following functions:

- 1. Approve, monitor, and evaluate the implementation of the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan and regularly review and test the plan consistent with other national and local planning programs;
- 2. Ensure the integration of disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation into local development plans, programs, and budgets as a strategy for sustainable development and poverty reduction;
- 3. Recommend the implementation of the forced or pre-emptive evacuation of local residents, if necessary; and
- 4. Convene the CDRRMC once every three (3) months or as necessary.

Section 3. SECRETARIAT. The City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office shall serve as the secretariat of the CDRRMC as provided in Section 12 of Republic Act No. 10121. As such, they shall handle the documentation proceedings of CDRRMC activities; shall keep the necessary records on file; prepare and release the necessary communication papers for the CDRRMC, and take charge of all other secretariat functions as needed.

Section 4. FUNDING. The City Government shall allocate funds for the purpose of implementing CDRRMC programs and projects. CDRRMC members may likewise pool their respective agencies' resources for complementation and augmentation purposes to raise required funds to effectively and efficiently implement identified undertakings and activities of the Council as contained in the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan. CDRRMC may likewise tap other possible

sources of funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing policies, rules, and procedures.

Section 5. EFFECTIVITY. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon approval hereof and shall remain in full force and effect unless sooner revoked or amended by the Local Chief Executive.
