

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 47

Series of 2022

AN ORDER RECONSTITUTING THE INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM (ICS), AMENDING ITS ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE, AND APPOINTING KEY PERSONNEL THEREIN

WHEREAS, Memorandum No. 4, Series of 2012, issued by the NDRRMC Executive Committee authorizes the use of Incident Command System (ICS) as an On-Scene Disaster Response and Management Mechanism under the Philippines DRRM System.

WHEREAS, the continuous implementation of ICS will provide tactical preparation in all city activities which involves big crowd participation, as well as projection of mitigation measures to reduce or eliminate risk to people and property.

WHEREAS, due to personnel movement, there is a need to reconstitute the organizational structure of the Incident Command System and appoint the key persons to manage the preparation of the city which will be coordinated with the component response office in the City Government.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALEX L. ADVINCULA, Chairperson CDRRMC, City Mayor, City of Imus, Province of Cavite, by virtue of the powers vested in me, hereby order THAT:

Section 1. The CDRRMC shall continue to implement the Incident Command System in the city as a mandatory incident management preparation for any bigger crowd participation and for disaster response operations.

Section 2. The Organizational Structure of the Incident Command System with its position and staff, as provided for in Republic Act No. 10121, are as follows;

Section 3. The basic functions of the **Incident Commander/s** shall be as follows:

- a. The Incident Commander is responsible for overall management response operations.
- b. The Incident Commander is selected by qualifications and experience.
- c. Determines incident objectives and strategies.
- d. Establishes priorities in consultation with the staff.
- e. Establishes Incident Command Post (ICP).
- f. Establish appropriate ICS organization based on the situation.
- g. Ensures planning meeting are scheduled as required.
- h. Approves and authorizes the implementation of the Incident Action Plan.
- i. Ensures that adequate safety measures are in place.
- j. Coordinates with key people and officials.
- k. Overall authority and responsibility for conducting incident operations.
- I. Ensures availability of resources and will serve as link to higher authorities.
- m. Authorizes release of information to the news media.

Information Officer

- a. Central point for information dissemination
- b. Works closely with all the different information officers/media
- c. Ask approval of the Incident Commander before media releases

Liaison Officer

- a. Contact point for representatives of assisting and cooperating agencies (DRRMC member and partner agencies
- b. Assisting agency provides tactical or service resources

Safety Officer

- a. Work with operations on tactic
- b. Anticipate, detect, and correct unsafe situations
- c. Has emergency authority to stop unsafe acts/operations



Operation Section Chief

- a. Directs and coordinates all incident tactical operations
- b. Supervises in the staging areas and monitor various operation teams such as communication and warning, pre-emptive evacuation and transportation, evacuation and relief and search and rescue groups

Planning Section Chief

- a. Maintains resource status
- b. Maintain situation status
- c. Prepares Incident Action Plan
- d. Provides documentation service
- e. Prepares demobilization plan
- f. Provide technical specialists

Logistics Section Chief

- a. Provide services and support to the incident commander
- b. Responsible for:
 - Facilities
 - Transportation
 - Communications
 - Supplies
 - Equipment Maintenance and Fuel
 - Food Services
 - Medical Services

Finance/Administration Section Chief

- a. Monitors incident costs
- b. Maintains financial records
- c. Administer procurements
- d. Perform time recordings

Section 4. Operation- The Incident Management System shall be implemented in the following situation, as follows;

- 1. The assessed potential threat of typhoon, flooding, earthquake, or any disaster from minimum critical preparedness situation to extreme or a worst case scenario:
- 2. City or coordinated activity with bigger crowd participation;
- 3. National or regional coordinated assembly of VIPs;



- **Section 5.** All target operations shall be called upon by the CDRRMC Chairperson to convene at the soonest possible time in order to make an assessment of potential threats and critical preparedness set-up.
- **Section 6. Information-** a copy of this order shall furnish all concerns for their information and guidance.
- **Section 7. Separability Clause-** If any provision of this Order shall be held invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions thereof not affected hereby shall remain in full force and effect.
- **Section 8. Effectivity-** This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon the approval hereof and shall remain in full force and effect unless sooner revoked or amended by the Local Chief Executive.
