**AN ORDER RECONSTITUTING THE EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAMS OF THE
CDRRMC**

WHEREAS, the City has been exposed not only to natural hazards such as Typhoon, Flooding, and Earthquake, but also Human Induced-Hazards.

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10121 otherwise known as the "*Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management System of 2012*" mandates the NDRRMC to provide the principal framework in disaster risk reduction and management, and the City needs to adhere to the said framework.

WHEREAS, consistent with the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Framework, the City Government of Imus intends to reconstitute the various emergency response teams under the CDRRMC to effectively respond to natural and human-induced hazards.

NOW, therefore, I, ALEX L. ADVINCULA, Chairperson CDRRMC, City Mayor of Imus, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order:

Section 1. Reconstitution. The various Emergency Response Teams under the CDRRMC are hereby reconstituted:

The foregoing teams shall be formed and reconstituted within 24 hours upon issuance of this order, as a vital response mechanism of the city to any eventualities.

Section 2. Funding. - The enhancement of their capacities and skills shall be programmed by the CDRRMO, the cost of which shall be charged against the LDRRMF AIP every year.



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
Section 3. Report. The concerned office shall submit their team composition, with the corresponding skills and capacities, and the changes made on their roster for such information and guidance.

Each team shall submit an accomplishment report and the schedule of their operations to the Office of the Mayor every quarter.

Section 4. Separability Clause- If any provision of this Order shall be held invalid, or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions thereof not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Effectivity- This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon the approval hereof and shall remain in full force and effect unless sooner revoked or amended by the Local Chief Executive.
